MINSTER LOVELL NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Neighbourhood planning is a right for communities introduced through the Localism Act, 2011. Neighbourhood Plans (NPs) are legally binding planning documents. They must comply with both local and national, higher-level planning policies, and they are about allowing villages, towns or neighbourhoods to shape development in that area. A final NP is a set of policies related to land use, identifying what is best for the locality and what is needed to deliver tangible changes to that place.

Minster Lovell Parish Council is undertaking a Neighbourhood Plan. To begin this process, the Parish Council held a consultation event in March 2025. 70 residents came along. The event included presentations about what a Neighbourhood Plan can and cannot do and asked for initial thoughts and feedback. This feedback has been shared on the Parish Council website.

The Parish Council, via the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee, has commissioned Community First Oxfordshire to support the development of the Plan.

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN SURVEY – MARCH 2023

The intent of the Neighbourhood Plan Survey was to further explore the themes discussed at the launch event (and other topics). The questions were developed by the Steering Committee, supported and advised by Community First.

DISTRIBUTION AND RESPONSE

In order to carry out the Community Survey, a printed survey and *Freepost* return envelope was delivered to 712 households in Minster Lovell by members of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee in June 2025.

Residents were invited to respond to the Community Survey by either returning a completed hard copy survey or accessing a *Survey Monkey* internet link. The survey deadline was 30 July 2025.

Community First analysed the survey returns and produced this report.

200 survey responses were received (28% response rate)



1. How many people, including yourself, live in your household?














7. If you think new housing development is required in Minster Lovell, how many new homes do you think should be built?








12. Do you think the Neighbourhood Plan should explore policies and projects which offer positive local responses to climate change?











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
25. Which of the following methods of transport would you like to make use of more often?










45. What type of home would best meet your needs?


46. Which of the following would be best for you?


47. How many bedrooms would your new home need?

Just moved to Minster and very happy here - it's a friendly village with great character buildings and houses. We are worried about the impact of further development on the character of the village.

Fast losing its identity as a village - so sad.

I cannot stress enough how much the village does not need any new housing. We are a small rural village with a strong historic background and wish to stay as one. Dovecote Park is an ugly add on and has stretched our infrastructure to breaking point. The water situation is infuriating! Sewage is pouring into our homes and villages and Thames Water does nothing. It is near impossible to get a GP appointment. Protect our wildlife.

Beautiful village with great historic links - has many visitors from all over the world. Also, one of only 5 Chartist villages. All this needs to be preserved. Yes, there may be a need for new housing but it needs to be in the right place with the right infrastructure. According to WODC, Minster Lovell has done its bit with Dovecote Park - this has put a strain on the infrastructure already as well as causing social problems and increasing crime. We need to preserve the community spirit and protect the abundant wildlife.

Old part of village - biggest issue is increased number of visitors with limited unrestricted parking. Often witness haphazard parking which would deter access to emergency vehicles. Our garage access is frequently blocked despite signage and our wheelie bins get moved and used by visitors. They are rude and disrespectful of residents and each other, often arguing over rights of way and parking spaces, and on a few occasions has escalated to physical violence. We appreciate you have no control over visitor numbers but lack of parking is a major issue and on sunny days we are reluctant to go out and our family consider it a nightmare to visit. The ideal solution would be to make parking resident only, i.e. Bibury.

I really enjoy living here, it is a very friendly village and I am keen for it to remain that way. More housing will spoil the current culture, also the water supply! I would like to see more leisure facilities.

Waste of time as local and parish councils ignore all the comments and do what they like.

Housing development in and adjacent to Charterville has expanded enormously over the past few years; it has now arguably exceeded the limits of sustainability and should go no further. Old Minster Lovell became a Conservation Area in 1990. As described in the WODC document - Conservation Area Character Appraisal, p.2, para 2 "Famed since the early 19th century for the scenic ruins of its medieval manor house, 'old' Minster Lovell is a small, highly attractive village, whose distinctive character derives much from its idyllic riverside setting". Likewise, in the WODC document Minster Lovell - Proposals for Preservation and Enhancement, p.2, para 5, "Special care must be taken to ensure that views into and out of the Conservation Area, as well as views within the Conservation Area, are not harmed." This status must be maintained for the benefit of future generations; in particular, no development should be undertaken in any of the greenfield sites within and around the village.

Tired of paying high water rates when frequently get water outages. We should get lower bills or compensation. School needs designated car park, big nuisance.

There are many areas of the village I can't access in a wheelchair. Bin days = blocking of pavements, plus overgrown hedges and narrow pathways. Dropped kerbs not low enough to safely use.

No more housing

Moved here 43 years ago. During that time, small-scale building developments have been carried out and blended gently into the village. The new estate is a travesty and should never have been allowed and will bring pressure to have similar. If only affordable housing could be available for young residents but it's not enforceable or practical. Anecdotal evidence suggests some of the social housing has not been a success at the new estate, introducing social problems that didn't exist before.

Can we keep our village a village please. Improve bus connectivity and walking/cycling routes.

More small bungalows needed for elderly or people who want to downsize, to either buy or rent.

20mph speed limit on Wenrise Drive was a complete waste of money - it has had no impact. Slowing traffic in general is a bad idea as it leads to congestion and therefore more pollution. Driving at 20mph is significantly more polluting than 30mph. Give us back our freedom of choice. Mixing social housing with larger purchased properties does not work. Trapped in home unable to sell/move. Clarion Housing take no responsibility and local council do nothing to help.

Please sort out speeding from Freeland chicane to top of Bushey Ground, and traffic speeding up from just before Bushey Ground turn to leaving village.

Thank you for giving us a voice and listening to our opinion. Minster Lovell is a wonderful place to live.

Do not build another development of poor quality and design of Dovecote Close. Infrastructure here can't cope with the development. Water and power cut out, roads are too narrow, no future proofing whatsoever, no renewables, the only good thing is the LED street lighting.

Better infrastructure for water - bills going up but regular incidents of no water with no compensation. Sort parking at school with fines/bans etc. Place pallet bug houses around village to attract wildlife.

Amazed at how quickly farmland has been sold off to developers to build on. Once it's gone, it's gone.

There should be no further development in or around Minster Lovell. The cleaning up of the River Windrush should be treated as priority and steps should be taken to prevent any further sewage or pollution.

Get rid of 20mph limits and 50mph Asthall-Burford. 30 and 40mph should occur in Witney.

Edges of roads bad. Violations of planning applications not stopped.

The village is just that - a village! It would be a tragedy for more development to result in it being absorbed into Witney.

With more houses, a Minster Lovell GP surgery. A roundabout at the bottom of Brize Norton Road - it would slow the traffic down and ease access.

When the new development next to Dovecote was signed off last January and WODC agreed it was a suitable plan against their own councillor's better judgement and the villager's wishes, we, the local residents, lost faith. All of the issues in Minster Lovell can't be magically resolved without a serious amount of financial investment. Even so, due to its limitations in road systems, facilities, and location, you can't turn Minster Lovell into a medium sized village with hundreds more houses.

Should there be any further development then the water situation needs to be able to cope. The school is full. There was talk of a new cemetery but this hasn't come about. Doctor's surgeries can't cope. The character of the village should be maintained. Police patrols/village PC to help with vandalism and anti-social behaviour we have sometimes experienced. Maybe use scout hut for a youth club.

I would like to see an Annual Village Day where all the organisations and Businesses could take part in

an endeavour to bring the village together. On the following page it asks if anyone would like to get involved in community projects but only list those headed up by the council.

Keen to preserve current level of development - the village has seen sufficient development. Preserve green spaces.

Pity a survey like this was not undertaken before the building of Dovecote Park. It was too big for the village and houses were placed overlooking other properties.

No point, you didn't stop the houses and house values have gone down.

The Village offers a vibrant community with a good range of facilities for everyone. The Village should have no further development so that the unique rural and historic character of the Village can be maintained for future generations to enjoy. There is a strong community spirit that is maintained by a community of our size.

Keep village as lovely as it is. Water infrastructure will not be sufficient for new homes as we have low water pressure on regular occasions. Path along Burford Road is not safe to walk along.

Biggest concern about any new development is infrastructure. Power cuts and loss of water experienced. Any new development needs a better supply which must be added first.

Village is in danger of losing its historic character and charm due to over-development. Infrastructure such as water and sewage a concern. New development occupants should be encouraged to join the community.

We think ML has taken its fair share of development.

No more housing estates please.

I don't mind small housing developments in the current size of the village but if larger developments are made it will lose itself as a village. If more of it is social housing, then crime will go up. Following the development at Dovecote we have constant mini power cuts which stops water to certain parts of the village.

I need more help working on bike path and school hill, Church Lane, the Stile walk down to school hill.

We would like to have better access to Oxford via a direct bus and easily accessible train access to London and Oxford.

Thank you for asking for my views.

The problem is the plans are that looking at the plans we will become part of Witney except for the field behind the allotments which developers will use as a green space, the agreed plans for the further development of the new housing estate that the secretary of state as agreed although the water supply to village is at maximum already.

Minster Lovell is a beautiful but isolating village.

Any social housing built in the village should be for local people from the village. Soon the village will be joined to Witney if all the new developments in West Witney continue. The village has had all the additional housing it can support at the moment. Thames Water is a big problem for the river and the

reliability of facilities to households.

Water pressure is major concern.

Have recently moved here - would love to find support and art activities.

Going to Old Minster by car when you get to the bridge you can't see anything coming over the bridge because of a hedge that should not have been allowed to be planted.

Fines for parking on pavements. Youth vandalism in village needs addressing. Dog fouling on peoples property/gardens.

A number of footpaths around St kenelms close and Charterville close are reduced due to excessive planting, all the footpaths within the village should be kept clear.

Keeping both parts of the village integrated in whatever happens is important, providing common meeting spaces for recreation and worship are important too for all ages.

Speed limit on Burford Road to high. Cameras are required to lower speed limits. Council needs to cut the grass outside Dovecote estate as it becomes very dangerous exiting the estate due to length of grass.


Love living in Minster Lovell but worried it will lose its identity if the scale of house predicted are built.
